VIBRANT NEIGHBORHOODS



Neighborhood leadership, neighborhood safety, neighborhood beautification if it has to do with neighborhoods, the City of Tallahassee is engaged. The City provides a variety of programs, grants and support that strengthen local neighborhoods and empower residents.

For example, leading up to hurricane season, the City offers Neighborhood PREP (Plan for Readiness and Emergency Preparedness) workshops during which participants learn what supplies to have on hand, steps to protect their homes and resources available that can help them and their neighbors organize before and after a storm. Check Talgov.com in mid-April for dates and more information.

Every neighborhood has unique needs and goals, and residents are actively engaged across the community. To celebrate the individual achievements of neighborhoods and neighbors each year, the City hosts a Neighborhood Awards program. Applications typically open in spring.

Another popular program is the City's Neighborhood Leadership Academy. Each fall, a cohort of residents gets a first-hand look at the breadth and depth of City services through this multi-week program. Applications typically open in August. To aid resident-led initiatives, the City offers support for neighborhood planning through the Neighborhood First process and for special projects through the Vibrant Neighborhood Grants program. Help is even available to organize a neighborhood cleanup!

To help neighborhoods access these offerings and more, each neighborhood within the City of Tallahassee's boundaries has a Neighborhood Services Coordinator (NSC) assigned to it. It is the role of NSCs to serve as liaisons between neighborhoods and the City, helping residents effectively access City services and get issues resolved. Not sure who your NSC is? GROW YOUR GARDEN

Just in time for spring, rain garden grants are again available through the City's Think About Personal Pollution (TAPP) program. A rain garden is a landscaped area that is designed to capture and hold excess rainwater for a short period of time, allowing it to soak into the soil and recharge the groundwater. They help slow the flow of water from a yard during and after a storm, which helps reduce water pollution to area waterbodies. Grant applications will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis until May 31, 2023. Only owners of property located within the Tallahassee City limits are eligible, and first-time applicants will receive priority. Access the application and more information at TAPPwater.org.

YARD WASTE TIPS

Spring is fast approaching, and soon, utility customers will be placing piles of yard debris curbside for collection. Yard debris refers to vegetative fragments like tree trimmings, grass clippings, pine straw and leaves. Residential yard debris is collected from behind the curb in front of each residence every other week, When disposing of yard debris, place it within three feet of the curb and away from low-hanging wires, trees and other obstacles, such as mailboxes, fences, etc. Clippings and pine straw may be placed in clear bags or boxes. Limbs must be smaller than 4 inches in diameter and less than 6 feet long. Each pile of limbs and shrubs must be smaller than 6 feet long, 4 feet wide and 4 feet high. Place yard waste, bags and bulky items in separate piles for pickup no earlier than the weekend before your designated Red or Blue Week. For more information, visit Talgov.com/YOU.
